

# "For you are dust, and to dust you shall return." - Genesis 3:19

It doesn't seem all that long ago that I wrote to you in the August newsletter about all the programs, events, and improvements that have taken place at St. Ann this past year. Yet here I am, once again writing to my beloved parishioners and thinking about the closing of this year, with the Advent and Christmas seasons quickly approaching.

The speed at which time passes should not surprise us, although it always does. In James 4:14 we are told, "You have no idea what your life will be like tomorrow. You are a puff of smoke that appears briefly and then disappears." This quote is timely, given that at the beginning of November we are reminded of our mortality in two ways: All Saints Day on November 1st and All Souls Day on November 2nd.

On All Saints Day we remember those special men and women whose lives, although not perfect, still obtained sainthood because of their faithfulness and devotion to Jesus and His Kingdom on earth. In fact, this year's Christmas gift (sorry to ruin the surprise) for the parish is a book called *Rediscover the Saints*, reminding us that the saints are not long gone but alive and well, ready to help us on our journey to sainthood. The Church holds the Saints in high regard, and is why All Saints Day is not only just a Solemnity, the highest ranking type of feast day, but also a Holy Day of Obligation.

The Church also designated November 2nd to commemorate the souls in the process of obtaining heaven (purgatory) and our prayers to help them achieve this, or All Souls Day. On Saturday, November 2, we will celebrate a special Mass of Remembrance for parishioners who have died in the past year. But this special Mass is not our only way of honoring and remembering our faithful departed. At St. Ann, we also have the Legacy Garden, which offers parishioners a way to ensure that their parish is able to continue and enhance the Kingdom in our community, so that future parishioners will have liturgies, sacraments, and religious education to make the next generation of saints.

If you would like to remember St. Ann in your will, please contact Tim Clifford in the parish office to discuss the various levels of the St. Ann Legacy Society. We know that not everyone can participate at the

same level, and Tim can provide options for you to consider.

As we hear on Ash Wednesday, "Remember that you are dust, and unto dust you shall return." Our time on earth is limited and, as many of you can attest, it passes quickly. This is why it is important to make sure that we are living like saints today and being good stewards of God's gifts.

As we approach a new year we are reminded of the new opportunities and future hopes that are always upon us. Take, for example, our seminarian intern, Ethan. One day he will be a priest, and who knows, maybe future pastor of St. Ann??? God continues to renew the Church, the parish, and each of us because God is the Giver of light and Source of all that is good.

Hello. My name is Ethan Hoying and I extend my gratitude and appreciation to St. Ann's for the warm welcome and generous hospitality with which this vibrant community has greeted me in my first months.

Prior to entering seminary, I grew up on a small family farm outside the town of Russia (pronounced *Roo-she*), Ohio where I graduated from Russia K-12 Public School in 2013. My parents are Mark and Gina Hoying and my grandparents are Francis and Leola Hoying and the late Marion and Emily Grillot, all of Russia, OH. I have two brothers and a sister. I am also fortunate to have two little nieces. My family and I are members of St. Remy Parish.

I graduated in May 2017 with a B.A. in honors philosophy from the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio. Founded in 1888, the Josephinum is one of the two college seminary programs of which the Archdiocese of Cincinnati sponsors college-level seminarians (the other is Bishop Simon Brute College Seminary in Indianapolis). Uniquely, as the only pontifical seminary outside of Italy, the Josephinum is a pontifical institution which is not under the governance of any diocesan bishop, but is instead immediately subject to the Holy See, through the Apostolic Nuncio to the United States.

Upon graduation from the Josephinum, I entered major seminary in August 2017 at Mount Saint Mary's Seminary of the West, the Athenaeum of Ohio. Founded in 1829 by Bishop Fenwick, Mount Saint Mary's is our archdiocesan seminary and the place where I have called home for the past two years. In total, I have been a seminarian now for six years, and I have three more years (including this year) until priestly ordination.

It is with great joy that I will spend the next year

at St. Ann as part of my priestly formation. In addition to gaining valuable parish experience, I look forward to personally getting to know many of you over the next several months. Please keep me in your prayers and trust in my prayers for the St. Ann parish family. May God bless you for your generous support.

The inaugural **St. Ann Car and Craft Show** was a great time and a huge success on September 7.




























The kids of our parish had a fun night playing while their parents got a night away on our first Parents' Night Out of the year on October 4.






#### 33 Days to Morning Glory

# **THE PAVILION PROJECT**

The number one challenge that every church faces today is how do we get our young families and youth involved in the life of the parish. St. Ann is no different. During our Engagement Process, this challenge was identified as our greatest challenge by a wide margin.

The reality of this challenge is that the Parish used to be the center of all activities 25 years ago and before, and it was not an issue. In the 2000's, there became a ton of other alternatives that took the focus of a Catholic family away from the Parish. Some major changes that effected families, are that both parents are working, select sports teams took over for community teams, Catholic Education was starting to get expensive and many more factors.

As we investigated this challenge, we discovered one common request from our youth and young families - "we need a place that we can call ours and be able to do stuff." The Pavilion Project is that place here at St. Ann. This project would include a 40 X 60 covered pavilion with a concession area and seating, a sand volleyball court and a large fire pit area.

The initial building of the pavilion cost \$50,000 of which we have \$25,000 already. We are looking to have parishioners donate the remainder and give us that place for our youth and young families. # THE ROAD TO GOD IS PAVED WITH ..... EDUCATION!

In his apostolic exhortation entitled *Sacramentum Caritatis* (Sacrament of Charity) – Pope Benedict XVI explains that despite how well we plan and execute the liturgy, there is a need to provide an *education in eucharistic faith* capable of enabling the faithful to live personally what they celebrate. The faithful can more fully participate in the beauty of the faith by more deeply understanding the mysteries of the faith.

Pope Benedict is emphasizing the challenge of the Catholic faith which truly demands that we earnestly seek to learn more about the teachings of the Church. Because it is through learning about the Trinity and other doctrines of the faith that we can grow closer in relationship to God and thereby more fully participate in the Sacraments. In Paragraph 1210 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we read:

"The seven sacraments touch all the stages and all the important moments of Christian life: they give birth and increase, healing and mission to the Christian's life of faith. There is thus a certain resemblance between the stages of natural life and the stages of the spiritual life."

This paragraph regarding the Sacraments ties in perfectly with the earlier statement from Pope Benedict because God reveals Himself to us differently as we grow older. Our understanding of our faith changes as we experience more in life – our experiences open our eyes to how our faith can play a role in our lives and those of our loved ones.

Are you prioritizing your Catholic faith education? You will be surprised, if you take the time to attend a class at the parish or log onto FORMED.org and watch a video or movie, that what you thought you knew is only scratching the surface of the beauty and depth of our Catholic faith.

God loves us so much, but we can only experience that love within our hearts *and minds* if we choose to expose ourselves to the faith and find ways to incorporate that faith within our daily lives and not just attending Mass on a weekly basis. God wants to spend time with us 24/7 – let us dedicate ourselves, as we enter the season of Advent, to learning something new about our faith and expressing deeper love for our Creator.



Greetings! As we begin to move toward the end of Liturgical Year C, I wanted to share with you some wonderful musical treats coming your way!

This past July, Father McCarthy and I attended a workshop on "Singing the Mass" at the Athenaeum. In the workshop we discussed incorporating the roots of our Catholic faith and traditions back into the Mass (i.e. Gregorian chant and Antiphons). You will notice the use of Antiphons instead of gathering hymns during the seasons of preparation (Advent and Lent). I am so excited to start using them for Advent because they are so beautiful and prayerful in their simplicity.

The Antiphons are meant to be sung just like a Responsorial Psalm. The cantor will intone the psalm tone, the congregation will repeat it, followed by a verse sung by the cantor, then back to the psalm tone. You will get the hang of it, and I think you all will really enjoy singing these beautiful melodies as we prepare for the birth of Our Lord.


